### **DEFINE**

- 1. <u>Sewage</u>; Waste water that comes from homes, offices, shops and factories etc.
- 2. Acid rain; The smokes emitted from the industries, powerstations and motor vehicles contains chemicals which eventually combines with the water present in the atmosphere and forms acid rain

### GIVE REASON

1. In some areas soil become too salty for crops to grow.

As the irrigation water evaporates in the sun, salt builds up in the top layer of the soil. This makes the soil or land too salty for crops to grow.
