Verbs

A Verb is a word or a combination of words that indicates action or a state of being or condition. A verb is the part of a sentence that tells us what the subject performs.

Example: run, swim, eat etc.

1. Zafar is throwing the football.
2. The dog ran across the yard.

Types of Verbs

a) Action Verbs: - Action verbs express specific action and are used any time you want to show an action or discuss someone doing something.

Eg. Waseem raises his hand.

b) Linking Verbs: - Explain a link between the subject of the sentence and a noun or adjective being linked to it.

Eg. Jason became a businessman.

c) Helping verbs:- Help or support the main verb.

Eg. Taniya could learn to fly helicopter.

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Tenses of the Verb

Three basic forms of verbs are past, present and future.

The **past tense** refers to an action that was already done.

The **present tense** is for present action.

The **future tense** is for an action that will be done.

Example

- 1) I **lived** in KSA. (Past Tense)
- 2) I **live** in KSA. (Present Tense)
- 3) I **will live** in KSA. (Future Tense)
