An adverb is a word which adds to the meaning of a verb. It tells us **how** a thing is done, **when** it is done, or **where** it is done.

The soldiers fought **bravely**.

How did the soldiers fight?

I hurt my hand **yesterday**.

When did you hurt your hand?

The children are waiting **outside**.

Where are the children waiting?

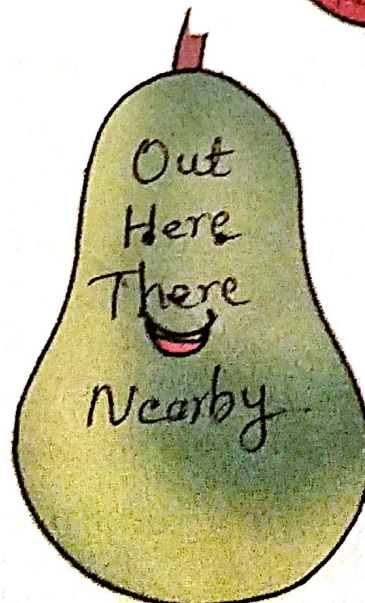

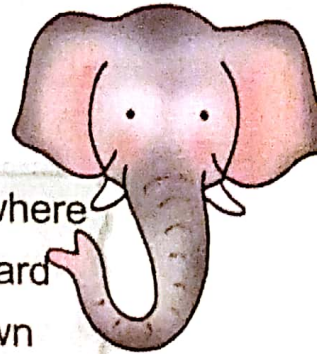
