What Is an Adverb?

An adverb is a word used to modify a verb, an adjective, or another adverb.

For example:

- She runs quickly.
 (Here, the adverb quickly modifies the verb runs.)
- She is an extremely quick runner.
 (Here, the adverb extremely modifies the adjective quick.)
- She runs extremely quickly.
 (Here, the adverb extremely modifies the adverb quickly.)

When an adverb modifies a verb, it usually tells us how, when, where, how often, and how much the action is performed.

Here are some examples of adverbs modifying verbs:

- . How: He ran quickly.
- . When: He ran yesterday.
- . Where: He ran here.
